## Registration:

Available through midnight on October 10, 2019! All workshop selections, sleeping arrangements, and shirt orders will be processed through the [Program/Events Registration](#). PLEASE NOTE – shirt orders will be processed as separate orders from your event registration, and will only be available as pre-orders through September 12, 2019. It is important to review your registration information thoroughly, before you place your order. Once submitted, **you will not be able to make any corrections yourself**. You can review your order information leading up to the event date, by logging onto your online registration account. Confirmation emails will also be sent out one week prior to the event.

## Refund Policy:

1. Any person cancelling more than 2 weeks before the event may request a refund.
2. Any person cancelling AFTER the 2-week deadline will not receive a refund because expenses for food, program activities, and administrative have already been incurred by that time.
3. Refunds are not issued for “no shows” (registrants who do not attend).
4. EXCEPTION – If a registrant has a personal emergency (medical, death in the family, or other), refunds may be issued at the discretion of the event staff.

## Additional Fees:

Please note that there are three courses this year that require an additional fee.

- Medic First-Aid/CPR – There will be an additional fee of \$30.00.
- Basic Outdoor Skills- There will be an additional fee of \$10.00.
  - For your convenience, we will be offering an Indoor Overnight Skills training immediately prior to this Basic Outdoor Skills training.
    - This means that you can complete both of the required overnight trainings at one time!
  - If you are interested in attending this Indoor Overnight Skills, you must register separately via online registration [here](#).

## Accommodations:

- Participants choose between cabin (C) or platform tents (T)
- Cabins are equipped with bunk beds, sleeping up to 26, and bunk choice will be on a first-come, first-serve basis. *You will not be able to choose top and bottom bunks during your online registration. We are asking that all volunteers be courteous and flexible and give bottom bunks to those who need them.*
- Participants choose between early to bed (lights out at 10pm) or night owls (up yet quiet).

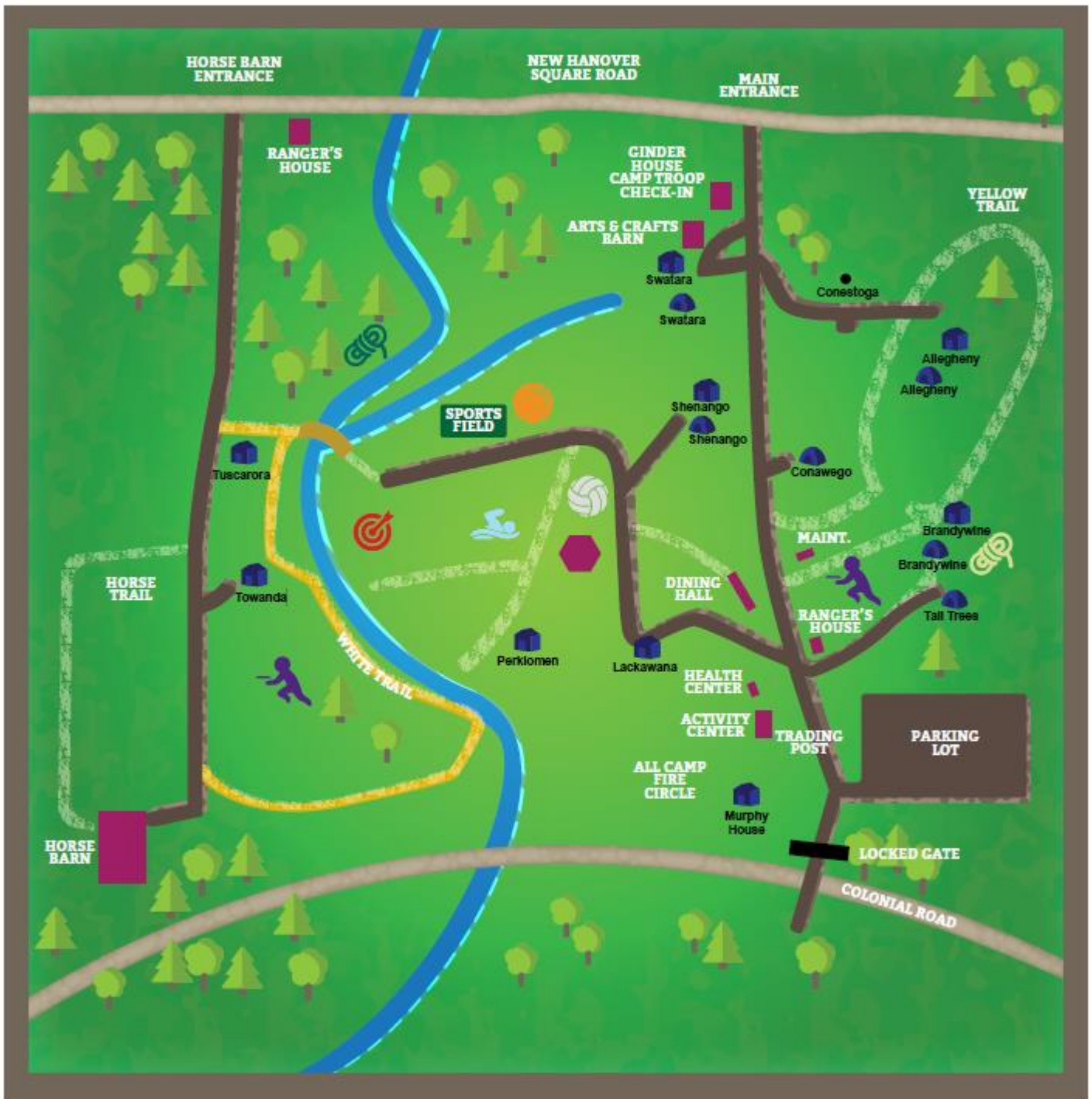
