Please note that there are new standards for CIT as well. There are now CIT/CIT I (available for 9-12 grade) and CIT II (only for 11 & 12 graders) which is for specializing in a program area such as Arts, Horseback riding (WIT), lifeguarding.

You will learn about leadership, safety and risk management, general camp management, childcare, and much more during the first two weeks of this program. During the second two weeks, you will participate in an internship, where you will be able to act as a 'counselor' for younger girls. Applicants must demonstrate maturity, commitment, and leadership potential, and be able to work well with others in a positive atmosphere. CITs will also enjoy traditional camp activities during their stay. Upon successful completion of this program, girls will earn the CIT I pin.

Prerequisite: Must have completed CIT or CIT I

If you have already completed CIT and you're looking for more specialized training, come be a part of CIT II. Camp Laughing Water's CIT II program offers specialization in Horseback Riding Instruction. Mosey

Wood's CIT II program will offer specialization in Waterfront—both swimming and boating—as well as Adventure/Teambuilding. Camp Tweedale offers specialization in aquatics, art, environmental education, tripping or as a Program Specialist. Camp Wood Haven offers specialization in Waterfront or Horseback Riding Instruction.

All specialty programs offer one week of reviewing the basics of working with younger girls, as well as in-depth training in your specialty. The last two weeks will be spent working with younger girls. Upon successful completion of this program, girls will earn the CIT II pin.

To work on Waterfront you must be a lifeguard. You will be expected to swim 550 yards using the freestyle and breast strokes, and retrieve a 10 lb brick from the bottom of the lake or pool before you can continue on with the Lifeguard certification. Your last two weeks will be learn a number

of useful skills, including how to facilitate teambuilding activities. You will discover how to run the rock wall and high ropes course, as well as how to implement various backpacking techniques. The last two weeks will be spent working with younger girls and helping them to experience the thrill of adventure.

The Horseback Riding Instruction is designed for the experienced rider with at least four years of extensive horse experience. Training includes shadowing members of the camp and riding staff and observing from behind the scenes how the program runs. In addition to this, you will learn advanced horse and stable management skills, herd care, and horse psychology; you'll also discover techniques for teaching and supervising horseback riding students, as well as learning equine medical emergency skills. Once this is all completed, you will put your newly acquired skills into practice.
