The fun and fantastic programs available at each camp are organized in alphabetical order by grade level. You will see one or more icons associated with each program description on the pages that follow. Please refer to the key on the left to determine what those icons mean.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Important Notes about Horseback Riding and Hiking

HORSEBACK RIDING

All girls are put into riding lessons based on their individual riding abilities. A Horseback Riding Questionnaire will be included with your Camp Confirmation Packet to help us determine your skill level. If we have questions about a camper's skill level she will be given a riding test to help us place her in the appropriate riding group. Please note that safety is our first concern with all of our programs but we are especially conscious of this in our Horseback Riding Programs. We will provide the girls with approved helmets but we do not provide foot wear. All participants must come to camp with the appropriate foot wear. Flat soled tennis shoes are not acceptable. Girls without the appropriate foot wear will not be able to ride. If you have any questions please contact the Camp Director.

Some of our programs are aimed towards the rider with a little more experience.

Below are pre-requisite levels for some of the riding programs. Please read them carefully and make sure you are qualified before you sign up.

Elementary Riding Level

- You should be able to tack, mount, do a tack check and adjust stirrups unaided.
- Ride with good position and balance at a walk, trot or jog.
- Be able to ride at least twice around the ring without breaking gait.
- Do simple reverses, circles or pattern at a jog or trot without breaking gait.
- Put horse into a lope or canter and ride at least once around the ring with good seat and control.
- Demonstrate correct jumping posture over poles or low cross rails.
- Dismount and lead horse away unaided.



Intermediate Riding Level

- Do everything at the Elementary level plus, be able to canter demonstrating a simple lead change on a Figure 8.
- Execute a halt from any gait and transition from one gait to another smoothly and promptly on command.
- Ride through turns and circles with the horse bending correctly.
- Demonstrate correct jumping over low single fences.

Advanced Riding Level

- Do everything at the Intermediate Level plus, posting trot on the correct diagonal, demonstrating change of direction on the diagonal.
- Be able to pass another rider and handle your horse when being passed.
- Be able to trot over cross rails, and canter over 2 feet varied fences.

HIKING PREREQUISITE

Campers must be in good physical condition and have broken-in hiking boots, but no prior backpacking experience is needed. Bring your own backpack or use one that belongs to the camp.

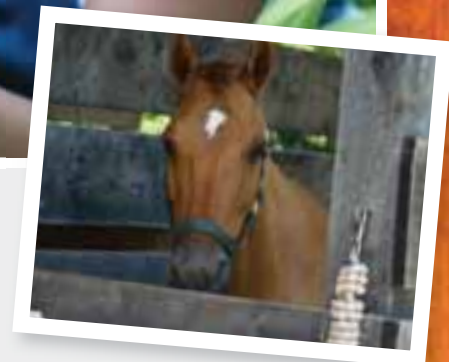


Special Notes To Remember While You Plan!

camp laughing waters

CLW



Located in the heart of Montgomery County, **LAUGHING WATERS** has 460 acres of gently rolling meadows, rippling creeks, and cool forests—perfect for the new or returning camper. Laughing Waters has a pool for daily swimming, a large sports field and various courts for games, an archery range, a nature center, and an amphitheater for all-camp campfires. Several Western Horseback Riding Programs are offered using our stables, ring, and trails. Campers stay in platform tents with 2-3 other girls their age, unless the program description specifies large cabins. Each unit (group of tents) has flush toilets and a unit shelter equipped with electricity. First-timers, as well as returning campers, love Laughing Waters' open, welcoming environment.

All girls who attend Camp Laughing Waters will participate in traditional camp activities, including a daily swim in the pool (weather permitting). Arts and crafts, cookouts, campfires, hikes, nature activities, singing, archery (Juniors and older), and games will be included in each week's programming. Girls who opt for a specialized program will have the opportunity to focus on their chosen theme while still enjoying standard activities.

IMPORTANT NOTE!

HALF-WEEK PROGRAMS AT CAMP LAUGHING WATERS Girls stay in a large cabin—equipped with electricity—alongside all of their group members and counselors. Campers attending the Outdoors and S’mores program, however, will spend their second night in a platform tent with 2-3 other girls.

HORSEBACK RIDING Please remember to check the prerequisites on page 23 for any horseback riding programs. Western riding style is used at Camp Laughing Waters.

Located on 425 acres in the Pocono Mountains **CAMP MOSEY WOOD** offers all girls traditional camp activities, including arts & crafts, cookouts, campfires, hikes, nature/science, singing, archery (Juniors & older), and wall-climbing (Cadettes & older), as well as teambuilding exercises and wishing candles. Everyone enjoys swimming and boating on a daily basis (weather permitting) and accommodations in platform tents that they share with 2-3 other girls.



By signing up for a specialized program, girls are able to experience all of the standard activities while also focusing on their chosen theme.

IMPORTANT NOTE!

SWIMMING PREREQUISITE Girls are required to undergo a swimming test upon arrival at camp; certain activities will be restricted based on swimming ability.

To participate in canoeing, or the Aqua Tower also known as “the blob,” girls must have passed American Red Cross level 2 swimming instruction.

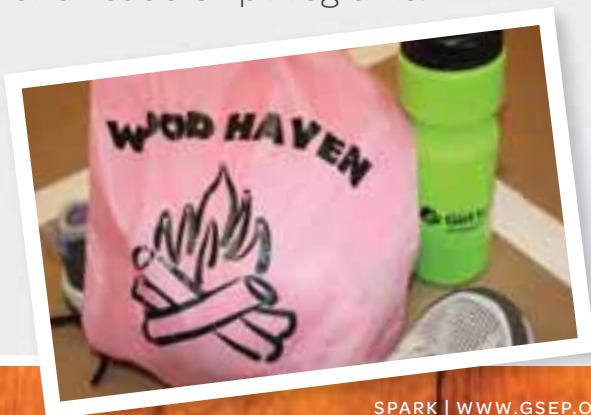
