8:30am-11:50am

Our double session workshops require approximately 3 hours to complete, taking the place of two sessions. If you select one of these sessions, you will not select workshops for sessions 1 and 2. Some of these workshops have an add-on fee, which is listed with each description.

First Aid/CPR Certification- In-Person Skills Assessment

Location: Ginder House

Add-on fee: \$30

This course covers rescue breathing, CPR and emergency care skills for infants, children, and adults; and prepares participants to serve as a first aid adult for most Girl Scout activities. This is a blended course. Participants will be required to complete the online pre-work prior to 10/22/21. Participants will then complete the in-person Skills Assessment session on 10/23/21. Please note: the training link email will be sent by Health & Safety Institute (HSI) a week prior to Fall Leadership Weekend. Participants who do not complete the online pre-work will NOT be admitted to the Skills Assessment session! Supplies you should bring from home: Notetaking materials

_ Basic Outdoor Skills Part 2- In-Person Skills

Location: Perkiomen Cabin

Add-on fee: \$12

In this session, participants will: Learn proper fire-starting methods and tools needed; Learn proper camp sanitation and outdoor dish washing; Practice minimum impact camping; and much more. This course is required to take girls on an outdoor overnight trip, to stay at a GSEP property, and to do camping activities such as fire-building, outdoor cooking, and tent camping. Please note: This is a blended course. Participants will be required to complete the online Basic Outdoor Skills Part 1 – Webinar prior to 10/22/21. Participants will then complete the in-person skills session on 10/23/21. Before taking this course you must have also completed the Indoor Overnight Skills training. Participants who do not complete the on-line part 1 webinar will NOT be admitted to the in-person skills session! Supplies you should bring from home: Pocket knife, mess kit with mesh/dunking bag & eating utensils, bandana

__ Let's Track CLW

Location: Pennypack

Let's see what critters live at Camp Laughing Waters! We will hike around camp to find and identify their tracks and signs. Various methods will be explored and we'll learn how to preserve what we find. 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___ First Time Camping Trips

Location: Lackawanna Cabin

Don't be intimidated by your first-time troop camping trip! Visualize a theme and incorporate badgework to learn hands on activities such as easy camp crafts, outdoor games, rainy day activities, and service projects you can do at camp. *This session does not replace the required Basic Outdoor Skills training. Supplies you should bring from home: Prewashed plain dark t-shirt (no fabric softener/dryer sheet), 2 -loz 3D fabric paints-colors choice gold/silver/bronze; small hammer; 6 sticks- size: 4-8 inches long & pencil to thickness of a finger with 1 flat end

__ Archery Level 1 Instructor Certification- In-Person Skills

Location: Eaglesmere Add-on fee: \$70

Graduates of the course will be well prepared to teach beginner archery programs to people of all ages and abilities in a variety of disciplines. This is a blended course. While originally an art form created by master craftsmen, girls of all ages can learn to create works of art using paint on glass. Learn how to transfer a simple image from paper to a glass inlaid picture frame. Painting supplies and sample transfer pictures provided. **Supplies you should bring from home:** A 5 x 7 picture frame with removable glass

__ 307- Intro to Backpacking

Location: Lackawanna Shelter

Are you ready to transition from hiking to backpacking? This workshop will cover all the essentials for an overnight backpacking trip. Explore a sample primitive campsite and the gear you need for a successful outing. We'll cover food choices, meal prep, and water purification. Learn how to pack a backpack, keep food safe from animals, and good land stewardship through "Leave No Trace" principles. No supplies from home.


___ 412- The Color of Your Personality
