Daisies can earn badges like the Eco Learner Badge, Good Neighbor Badge, and Roller Coaster Design Challenge Badge.




Daisy Activity: Draw Your Perfect Day

Juniors can earn badges like Paddle Boat Design, Outdoor Art Explorer Badge, and Simple Meals Badge.




Junior Activity: Girl Scout fortune teller.

Directions: Cut out the square, then fold the paper in half. Turn it and fold it in half again and crease it, so that you can see where the center of the paper is. Open the paper flat. With the print side facing down, fold each corner to meet in the middle. Turn the folded paper over so that the "fortunes" (small words) are facing up. Fold the paper in half with the numbers facing in and the words "I love Girl Scouts" facing out so that you can reach the "pockets" on the underside.

How to Play:

- 1. Hold the fortune teller with your fingers.
- 2. Pick a word. Spell out the letters of that word (e.g., L-O-V-E) while alternating a pinching and pulling motion with the teller.
- 3. The teller will reveal 4 numbers. Pick one and move the teller the corresponding number of times.
- Choose a number again, then open the flap and reveal which Girl Scout Cookie you should get!

Cadettes can earn badges like First Aid Badge, Animal Helper Badge, and Screenwriter Badge.




Cadette Activity: Create your own comic strip!
