Debbie Hassan, Chair

Debbie Hassan is an experienced professional who currently serves as both Board Chair of the Girl Scouts of Eastern Pennsylvania ("GSEP") and Chair of the Human Resources Committee. She is also one of two Council Board Chairs selected nationally to serve on the GSUSA CEO Search Committee in 2021. Prior roles with GSEP included that of Finance/Audit Committee Chair and non-board volunteer on the Board Development Committee. She is a past finance chair of the board of the Women's Business Enterprise Center – East (formerly Women's Business Development Center of Greater Philadelphia). She is on the advisory board of the Women's Leadership Forum (WLF) of Philadelphia and previously served as finance chair and a nominating committee member. 


