We have had an incredibly busy spring in the governance area, and we

you missed any of the meetings, here are the recaps: Spring Delegate Council Meeting (March 19)

The two primary topics of the spring meeting were the Board Development

#### Committee (BDC) preparations for the upcoming Annual Meeting and the start of the work for the 2026 National Council Session. Joann Gonzalez-Generals, a

Board member of the BDC, shared an overview this year's work to create six slates. She specifically presented a brief explanation of all the effort, discussion, and thought that went into developing the slates of the 27 members of the 2026 NC Delegation as well as the 30 Girl Delegates, to ensure representation of our entire Council in various diverse aspects. Board Chair Nicole LeVine shared a synopsis of the information and data that GSUSA presented to National Council Delegates during their 2025 State of the Movement webinar. Finally, Board member and NC Delegate Ellen Iobst talked about how the National Board establishes the agenda for the National Council Session (i.e., proposals and discussion topics). The Strategy Café discussions involved participants brainstorming ideas for GSEP's NC Delegation to craft into a formal proposal or discussion topic. The overview of the meeting can be found here. More than 210 Girl Scout Delegates, members, and families attended this year's

the Special DC meeting, our local Service Unit Delegates & Alternates and Girl Delegates heard a brief summary of each concept and then voted on whether to support moving the proposal or discussion topic forward to the National Board (not whether we supported the actual concept). For the first time, GSUSA had shared all these concepts so that all Councils could solicit input from their members. Board Chair Nicole LeVine explained that we will not hear the National Board's final decisions on which concepts to include in the NCS agenda until January 2026. **Continuing Governance Education** Why does developing a Proposal for the National Council Session take so long? For those of you who participated in the Spring Delegate Council Meeting, it may seem like an exceptionally long time between March 2025 and January

2026 to learn what ideas actually become an official part of the NCS agenda. And, many other Girl Scout Councils started this process long before GSEP did.

Because formal proposals involve amending the Girl Scout Constitution

All of these possibilities have deep and/or broad impact on our national

changing GSUSA's Bylaws, updating Policies in the Blue Book, creating task forces to research major projects, etc., these concepts cannot be taken lightly.

When local National Council Delegations begin the process of developing a formal proposal, they need to take into account what ramifications their idea has on our Movement as well as the cascading effect in all parts of the Blue Book (the national governance document). In other words, changing one word in one section may then require updating the text in other places in the Blue Book or may even result in the need to develop new policies altogether. At past National Council Sessions, discussion and debate on various ideas have lasted
