GSUSA First-Aid and CPR Approved Providers (March 2025- March 2027)

A First-Aider is an adult volunteer who has taken both First Aid and CPR training using Girl Scout approved providers, which include specific instructions for child CPR when appropriate. First-aid offerings listed in the below list have been approved by GSUSA and therefore are considered approved providers. GSEP offers First-Aider courses periodically throughout the year, however adult volunteers are also encouraged to take advantage of trainings offered in their local community or by these approved agencies.

Caution: First Aid and CPR training that is available entirely online does not satisfy Girl Scouts' requirements. A partially online course, with an in-person skills assessment is acceptable.

Upon receiving their certification, volunteers are asked to upload a copy of their certification card/certificate to their gsLearn account.

National First Aid/CPR Training Organizations:

Acceptable courses must include hands-on skills, and we need both First Aid and CPR, whether taken together or separately.

These professions may upload their professional license in place of a First Aid certification, along with a current CPR, BLS, or ACLS certification.
